What is CFCA?

[Christian Foundation for Children and Aging](#) is an international nonprofit assisting families living in poverty in developing countries. CFCA's Hope for a Family program brings people together through a sponsorship model in which one sponsor offers support and encouragement to a child, youth or aging person in a developing country.

- Established in 1981 in Kansas City, Mo.; headquarters in Kansas City, Kan.
- Founded by lay Catholics and rooted in Catholic social teaching, CFCA serves persons of all faith traditions.
- Only child sponsorship organization with an A+ rating from the [American Institute of Philanthropy](#).
- Among the 200 largest U.S. nonprofits, based on revenue, according to [Forbes Magazine](#).

How does CFCA work?

CFCA's Hope for a Family program takes a personal approach that focuses on building partnerships with individual families to help them create a path out of poverty. Sponsors contribute \$30 a month, which CFCA uses to provide sponsored friends and their families with basic life necessities, while empowering them to become self-sustaining through education, skills training, livelihood programs and community-building activities. Sponsors get to know their sponsored friends through letters and photographs. Some sponsors travel on CFCA-hosted mission awareness trips to meet their sponsored friends. - CFCA currently serves more than 300,000 children, youth and aging persons through the generous support of more than 250,000 sponsors, primarily in the U.S.
- CFCA has projects in [22 developing countries](#) located in five regions, including Mexico and Central America, the Caribbean, Asia, Africa and South America. (*Click link for a full list of countries*)
- More than 94 percent of [CFCA's expenses](#) go toward program support. The remaining 6 percent is used to cover fundraising and administrative expenses. (*Click link for complete financial reports*)

History

CFCA was established in 1981 by brothers Bob, Bud and Jim Hentzen, their sister Nadine Pearce and friend Jerry Tolle. Bob Hentzen, a former Christian Brother, and Tolle, a former Jesuit priest, worked in Central and South America for many years. They developed the sponsorship program to help people living in poverty and to help form real friendships between people from different cultures and economic circumstances.
